

What to do if a class is full

First – Check for Restrictions

- If the course has **MJ** next to it in ClassFinder, this means that it is **Major Restricted** and only students who are declared majors are allowed to take that course.
- If the course has **OV** next to it in ClassFinder, this means that an **Override**, or permission to take the class is needed from the instructor or the department.

Keep Checking ClassFinder

- Other students are adding and dropping classes all the time so watch and see if someone drops the class you want.
- Check often each day until the last day to add a class winter quarter: **Monday, January 12th**

Have a Plan B & C

- You should register for a full schedule of classes in case you are unable to add the class you are waiting for.
- Register for a class that you would be willing to give up that meets at the *same time* as the class you want add so that you can switch it into your schedule easily.

Attend the Class on the First Day

- Contact the professor to let them know that you are trying to get into their class.
- Attend the class on the first day to see if the professor has room to let you in.
- Don't miss the first day of class of any classes you wish to keep!
