## Another Season of Intramurals Begins at WWU

Campus Recreation Services is excited to begin another year of intramural sports play for all full time Western Washington University students. The Intramural Program is on it's second year of providing intramural play through the use of [Imleagues.com](http://Imleagues.com). By creating an account online, students are able to create and join intramural teams for each sport during the 2011-2012 academic year. Creating an account is quick and easy and allows students to view their game schedules, team standings and important

game information. Students can access step-by-step directions on how to create an [Imleagues.com](http://Imleagues.com) account through the Rec Center



website located on Western's main site. Each team captain is responsible for signing their team up online and paying the \$60 team fee at the Rec Center by the

registration deadline of September 24th. We recommend captains pay the team fee as soon as possible because that is the only way to confirm

their team's spot for that quarter. Another addition to the intramural program this year is the captain's video. Each captain will be required to watch an informational video prior to their team's

first game so that they can brush up on the rules and regulations of the intramural program. The intramural staff is looking forward to another exciting year of play!

## Referee Training Program

New this fall is the Referee Training Program, which includes participation by intramural patrons in the training process for student officials. There are a few advantages to being involved with the program for intramural participants in 2011-12. First, they will

be able to contribute and offer suggestions for new officials who aim to work fall quarter. Secondly, they will receive a better understanding of the operations that are involved with running the intramural program. Finally, the captain or

## Quest for the Best Intramural Team: Viking Cup

The WWU Intramural Program is proud to announce the newest feature of our program: The Championship Viking Cup. We are excited to begin our first year of awarding the best overall teams with the proud honor of winning the prestigious Viking Cup and having their team name engraved upon the cup. Each year we have teams that stick together throughout our three main quarters of intramural play, and we have decided to add a challenge and another reward for those teams beyond being awarded an intramural championship t-shirt. The Viking Cup will be awarded to the four teams each year that, over the course of all three quarters, consistently performs the best and receives the most points in one of two

ways. A team is eligible to win the Viking Cup by either receiving the most points in one of the three all quarter sports: soccer, volleyball or basketball or by combining their total points received from the combination of the limited quarter sports (softball, flag football and dodge ball) and minor sports (kickball, ultimate frisbee and floor hockey). For instance, if a team plays a limited quarter sport in the fall and winter such as dodge ball and flag football and then plays a minor sport such as kickball in the spring, they can compete for the Viking Cup as well. Teams must maintain the same team name and at least 50 percent of their roster in any sport they wish to earn Viking Cup points for and may earn

points in up to 4 different sports. Team captains should submit a roster of up to 30 team members that will then be allowed to earn points for that team over the entire year in the one to four sports the team may choose to participate in and earn Viking Cup points for. Players can still compete on as many teams as they wish but they can only earn points when playing for a team that has submitted a Viking Cup roster. Teams will be required to choose which sports they would like to score Viking Cup points for by November 1st (prior to playoffs in fall quarter). If you think your team has what it takes to contend for the Viking Cup, make sure you submit a roster to the Intramural Office!

## Fall Golf Tournament

The IM golf tournament will take place on Sunday, October 9th. Anyone associated with the WWU community is eligible to play for a fee of \$40.
