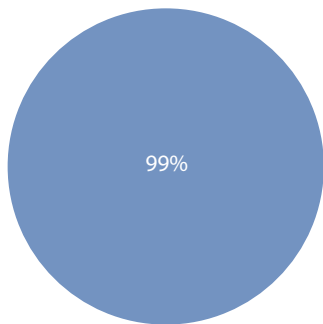

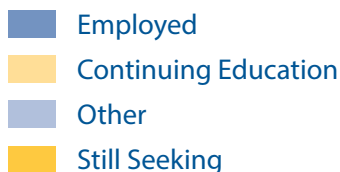
Bachelor's Degree Graduates

The Career Services Center of Western Washington University surveyed the graduates from the 2014-15 academic year (recipients of Bachelor degrees, Master degrees, and Teacher certifications). Graduates were invited to respond via email and then mailed hardcopy. Employment data were also supplied by the University's academic departments.

As a result of these efforts, data were collected from 43% of the 3,161 students who received Bachelor degrees; 83% of the 294 students who

received Teacher certification; and 82% of the 244 students who completed Master degrees in 2014-15. Highlights

Employment

The results of our 2014-15 survey indicate a continued optimism in the job market for recent grads. Bachelor degree recipients reported the largest gains. Eighty-three percent (83%) reported employment within six months of graduation, and field-related employment increased slightly to 61% from last year's 60%. However, average starting salaries were slightly down this year (by 1%), decreasing to \$38,732 as compared to \$39,049 last year.

Top employers of recent Bachelor degree graduates include (in order): AmeriCorps, PeaceHealth, Boeing, Starbucks, Bellingham School District, Lake Washington School District, Nordstrom, Mount Vernon School District, PACCAR, and Amazon.

Overall employment for recipients of teaching certificates improved to 99% this year (up from 96%), with 84% employed as teachers within Washington State. The employment rate for Master degree recipients was 87%, a decrease from the 93% in last year's results.

Internships

The value of internship experience was strongly supported again by this year's survey results. Graduates with internship experience found

employment slightly more quickly and reported an average starting salary that is about \$3,558 (10%) higher than students without internship experience.

Career and Internship Opportunities

The Career Services Center's free, online job and internship posting database is called Viking CareerLink (<https://www-csm.symplicity.com/>) and includes accounts from more than 4,200 employers and 14,300 students and alums.

At any given time, there are 800+ career and internship opportunities actively open and listed. Personalized job search results can be automatically emailed to subscribers.

Continuing Education

This year's percentage of Bachelor degree recipients seeking continued education (11.9%) is up somewhat from last year's results (11.2%). Continuing education was highest among disciplines such as Physics/Astronomy (53%), Philosophy (40%), Biology (29%), English (24%), and Geology (24%).

Western grads continue to be extremely competitive in gaining admission to a broad range of programs: Arizona State University (Instructional Technology/Design), Seattle University (Law), University of Miami (Physical Therapy), Syracuse University (International Business), Michigan State University (Community Sustainability), and Baylor University (Philosophy).
