

# Campus Community Coalition Steering Committee priorities for Coalition activities in the next 3-5 years

1. Continue Bellingham Police Department enforcement efforts (Party Patrol/liquor law emphasis patrols); expand Party Patrol to additional weekends that are not predictable	10
2. Continue distribution of “ <i>Think Locally-Act Neighborly</i> ” educational doorknockers at start of Fall quarter	9
3. Continue Liquor Control Board enforcement efforts of alcohol sales and underage drinking laws	9
4. Provide alcohol education to students before they arrive (e.g. Summerstart, Transitions, Fall Orientation)	7
5. Provide opportunities for law enforcement and students to connect early in WWU experience (non-confrontational)	6
6. Continue educational ads regarding alcohol related citations and their consequences in the <i>Western Front</i>	6
7. Increase consistent, recurring late night events on campus	6
8. Continue fall late night line-up of large-scale events	6
9. Continue and expand the Let’s Talk Forum “ <i>Living Together in Bellingham</i> ” (e.g. more frequent, include in New Student Orientation)	5
10. Identify students who live off-campus and provide off-campus living information	5
11. Provide alcohol education for high risk drinkers in Residence Halls (e.g., Prevention Specialist Life Style Advisors in Residence Halls, alcohol classes)	4
12. Use the WWU judicial system to provide sanctions for students who get citations off-campus (“WWU needs to be involved more in enforcement—off-campus behavior should affect students with consequences.”)	4
13. Increase restrictions on alcohol advertising/marketing on campus	4

# Campus Community Coalition Steering Committee priorities for Coalition activities in the next 3-5 years

## Activities receiving less than four Steering Committee member votes:

### Activities with 3 votes:

- Work with the neighborhood associations and City of Bellingham to have neighborhood events to connect neighbors and students in the beginning of the academic year
- Continue work with City of Bellingham to develop an effective mechanism to address chronic “problem party houses”
- Continue the *Off-Campus WWU: A Student Road Map to Neighborhood Living* website

### Activities with 2 votes:

- Require alcohol education for all freshmen or all new students (e.g. online AlcoholEdu)
- Provide off-campus living education to identified high risk drinkers (e.g. through ADCAS)
- Continue/expand community service alternatives for students receiving MIPs and other alcohol related offenses
- Develop late night transportation alternatives (i.e. “Safe Ride” programs)

### Activities with 1 vote:

- Expand classes offering academic credit for neighborhood involvement, like board membership, volunteer activities and other civic activism (more than just attendance/observation)
- Create a neighborhood/community impact panel or forum to involve offenders in restorative justice and positive community building

### Activities with 0 votes:

- Continue and enhance the Neighborhood Mediation Program
- Continue “*Connect with Your Neighbors*” ads in the *Western Front*
- Implement brief alcohol risk reduction/motivational interventions at the Student Health Center
- Create a required class based on the *Off-Campus WWU* website (“put ‘teeth’ into the website for students moving into neighborhoods; go back to the original plan to make it an online course.”)
- Offer late night events for students who live off-campus (alcohol-free group activities – coordinate with Bellis Fair Mall, movie theaters, etc.)
- Continue letter to rental property owners from CCC and Neighborhood Associations each fall
