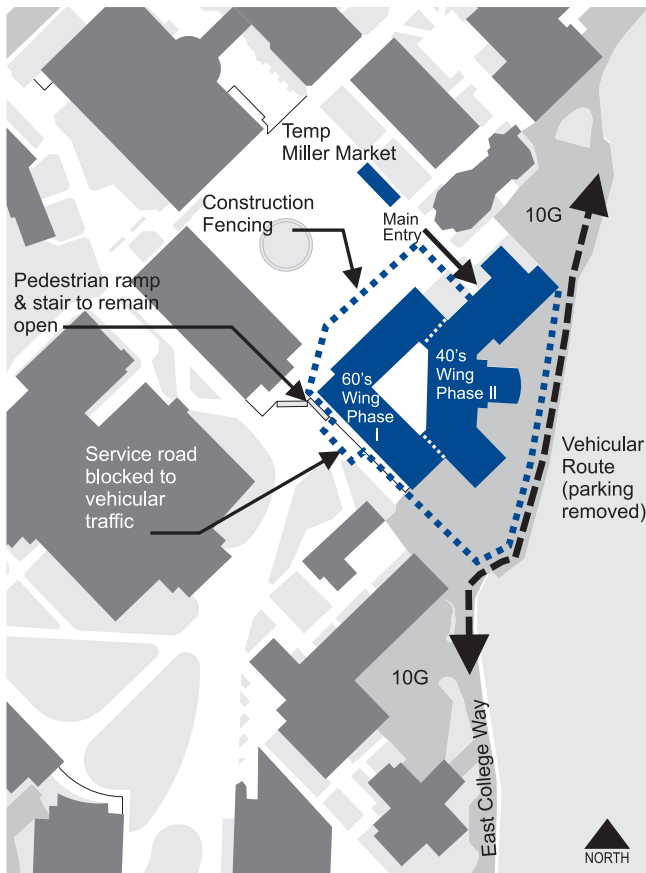
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## Special Edition for Miller Hall Renovation Project

### Schedule

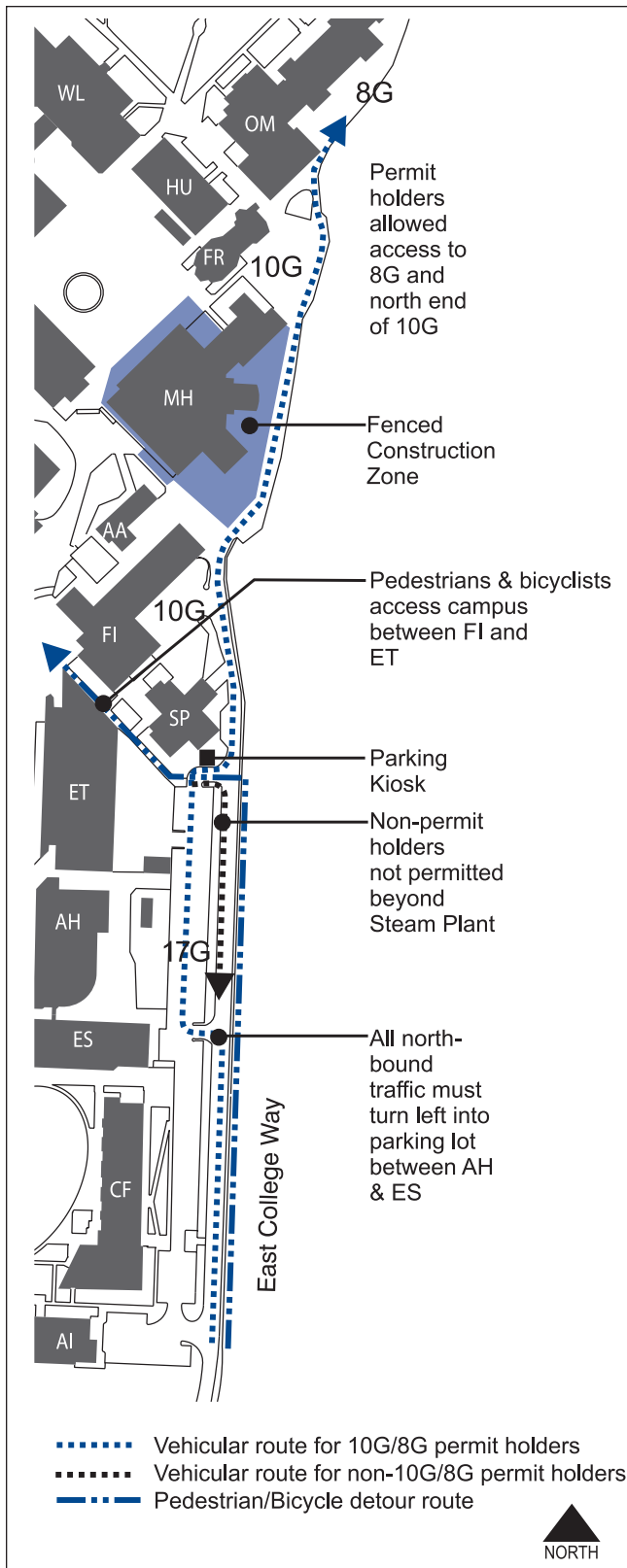
- Early July: ATM machine removed.
- Mid July: 1960's wing occupants (including Woodring College of Education and all WCE departments and programs) move into temporary spaces in the 1940's wing. Construction fencing installed.
- Late July: Bid opening for abatement and demolition work.
- Early August: Parking kiosk installed.
- Mid August: Begin demolition in 1960's wing.
- Late August: Relocated Miller Market opens in temporary trailer in Red Square.
- Late October: Demolition complete.

### Construction Impacts

#### PARKING:

- Stalls along the east side of Miller Hall will be permanently removed.
- Stalls adjacent to the Arboretum and adjacent to Fine Arts will be removed temporarily for the duration of construction.
- Disabled parking on the north side of Miller Hall will remain available.

# Miller Hall Renovation Project



## VEHICULAR CIRCULATION:

- Vehicular traffic north of the Steam Plant will be restricted to authorized vehicles and Parking Lot 8G and 10G (north end) permit holders only.
- Northbound traffic on East College Way must turn left into Parking Lot 17G between Environmental Studies and Arntzen Hall, continue north and stop at the new parking kiosk.\* The parking attendant will allow those with 10G or 8G parking permits through to the appropriate lot. Service and delivery vehicles will be allowed access as well. Those without appropriate business or permits will not be allowed access.
- Construction fencing will block east/west access between Miller Hall and Fine Arts. Temporary signage will indicate detour routes.

\* Note: This traffic revision will begin after the paving project in Parking Lot 17G is complete. From late August until the third week of September, the portion of Lot 17G behind Arntzen Hall will be closed for repaving and upgrades.

## PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE CIRCULATION:

- All pedestrians and bicyclists will be detoured off of East College Way between the Steam Plant and Ross Engineering Technology to avoid construction vehicles.
- The stretch of East College Way between Miller Hall and the Arboretum will be closed to both pedestrians and bicyclists.
- The only access to Miller Hall will be the northwest "bell tower" door (entry closest to Fraser Hall and off Red Square).
