Major Chemical Spill

1. Notify persons in the area.
2. Evacuate the room, area or building. If evacuation is required pull the nearest fire alarm station.
3. Call for emergency assistance.
4. Confine as possible. Close doors on the way out as possible.
5. Assemble in a safe place.
6. One person meet and inform emergency responders. Provide assistance as necessary.

Minor or Small Chemical Spills

1. Notify persons in the immediate area.
2. Leave the hazardous area.
3. If possible, turn off ignition sources, and establish or maintain exhaust ventilation.
4. Close doors and windows, if possible.
5. Call Environmental Health and Safety at x3064; leave message (activates pager).
6. Follow specific instructions on the Material Safety Data Sheet.
7. Confine and clean spill with appropriate protective clothing and equipment.
8. Dispose of wastes properly. Call Environmental Health and Safety for information.

Chemical Splash to Skin Be Prepared - Read Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS)

1. Generally, remove contaminated clothing and wash with water for 10 minutes.
2. Call 911 or seek medical assistance - during school, students use Student Health.
3. Call Environmental Health and Safety at x3064 for information.
4. Call University Police at x3911. During school, police can page Student Health physician.
5. Follow specific instructions on the Material Safety Data Sheet.
6. Take MSDS to emergency providers

Chemical Splash to Eyes

1. Immediately wash with potable water for 15 minutes.
2. Hold the eyelids open. Get the victim to roll eyes while irrigating.
3. Call 911 or seek medical assistance immediately - during school, students use Student Health.
4. Call University Police at 3911. During school, police can page Student Health physician.

Reporting and Follow-up

1. For a safety-related incident, notify Environmental Health and Safety.
2. Complete an accident report for all injuries.
3. For all fires/explosions/chemical spills, notify Academic Custodial Services/leave a message at x3932.

Medical Emergency

1. Call 911 for serious injury.
2. Also call x3911 for university police assistance and first aid.
3. During school times, students access Student Health. Call University Police for transport.
4. Provide first aid as training permits. Washington has a Good Samaritan law.
5. Whenever possible, notify supervisor.

Fire or Explosion

1. Notify persons in the area.
2. Evacuate the room, area, or building.
3. Pull the nearest fire alarm.
4. Confine as possible.
5. Use fire extinguisher, if trained.
6. Close doors and windows, if possible.
7. Assemble in a safe place.
8. One person meet and inform emergency responders. Provide assistance as necessary.

Clothing Fire

1. "STOP, DROP, AND ROLL"
2. Do not run or allow victim to run.
3. Drop to the floor.
4. Roll the victim to extinguish flames. Bring a blanket to the victim, if available.
5. Cool the victim with water or ice packs. Go to an emergency shower if close by.
6. Call 911/seek medical assistance.
7. Call University Police at x3911.

Burns

1. Cool the burned area with cold water.
2. Call 911/seek medical assistance.
3. Call University Police at x3911.

Reporting and Follow-up

1. For a safety-related incident, notify Environmental Health and Safety.
2. Complete an accident report for all injuries.
3. For all fires/explosions/chemical spills, notify Academic Custodial Services/leave a message at x3932.
