Traffic enforcement laws are both specific and subject to discretionary enforcement. Forde-Mazrui argues that the Supreme Court fails to appreciate that antidiscrimination review is ineffective when applied to broadly discretionary decisions. Judicial checks are required to maintain a balance between individual liberty and crime control.
