❖ **FAIRHAVEN SCHOLARSHIPS FOR WINTER QUARTER FOR ACS AND LDJ**

Each scholarship will be \$1000 split between winter and spring quarter (\$500 per quarter):

▶ **American Cultural Studies Scholarship - Deadline November 30th, 5pm**

This \$1,000 one-time nonrenewable scholarship will be awarded Winter Quarter to a Fairhaven student addressing issues of race/ethnicity, social and cultural theory, class, gender, and/or sexual orientation in his or her concentration or American Cultural Studies major—and with a demonstrated interest in community service (through volunteerism, for example). This scholarship considers financial need. The award will be divided into \$500 per academic quarter for Winter and Spring.

▶ **Law, Diversity and Justice Scholarship - Deadline November 30th, 5pm**

Two \$1,000 one-time nonrenewable scholarships will be awarded Winter Quarter to Fairhaven students committed to social justice within the legal system. One scholarship will be awarded to a student who has filed an LDJ concentration; the other will be awarded to a student with a demonstrated interest in Law, Diversity and Justice. This scholarship considers financial need. Each award will be divided into \$500 per academic quarter for Winter and Spring.

❖ **WORLD ISSUES FORUM**

Wednesday, November 4, Noon-1:20pm, Fairhaven College Auditorium. "Immigrant Youth's Contributions to Families and Society as Language and Culture Brokers", Marjorie Faulstich Orellana, Professor and Director of Faculty for the Teacher Education Program at the University of California, Los Angeles. The general assumption is that adult immigrants to U.S make contributions, while children are only a drain - they "take" from the educational and health systems without giving anything back. This is an assumption that bears reconsideration. Using illustrations from ethnographic data in three immigrant communities over a decade, she will show children at work in a variety of contexts and discuss how children experience their work.

Thursday, November 12, Arntzen Hall 100, Noon-1:20pm, "A Woman Among Warlords: The Extraordinary Story of the Afghan Woman Who Dares to Speak Out", Malalai Joya, Afghan Woman Activist and Parliamentarian. On a U.S. tour, Malalai Joya speaks of "Raising My Voice: The Extraordinary Story of the Afghan Woman Who Dares to Speak Out" (2009). Her book provides a true picture of young Afghans going through the occupation, the troubles of refugee camps and the feelings of these people towards those warlords who are once again ruling and not giving chance to the new generation to come forward and control their destiny.
